



Michael H. Jordan

Michael H. Jordan retired as Chairman Emeritus of EDS in 2008. He joined EDS in 2003 as EDS chairman and CEO. During his years at EDS, Jordan led a dramatic financial and operational turnaround. During this period, the company nearly doubled the value of its contract signings and drove significant improvements in its cost structure and financial foundation, while continuing to invest in next-generation service offerings and capabilities.

Jordan is the retired chairman and chief executive officer of CBS Corporation (formerly Westinghouse Electric Corporation), which he led through one of the most comprehensive transformations of a major U.S. corporation. Before joining Westinghouse, Jordan was a partner with Clayton, Dubilier and Rice, one of the oldest and most respected private investment firms in the world. Before that, he spent 18 years with PepsiCo, Inc. During this time, he served in numerous senior executive positions, including CFO of PepsiCo, Inc. and president and CEO of PepsiCo WorldWide Foods, which includes Frito-Lay. From 1964 to 1974, he was a consultant and principal with McKinsey & Company.

In addition to his professional and investment roles, Jordan is former chairman of the National Foreign Trade Council; a member of the Council on Foreign Relations; a trustee of The Brookings Institution; a former chairman of the U.S.-Japan Business Council; a director and former chairman of the United Negro College Fund; a former member of The Business Council; a former member of the board of trustees of the United States Council for International Business; a former member of the International Advisory Board of BritishAmerican Business Inc.; and a former member of the Business Roundtable. He also serves on the boards of several smaller, privately held companies.

Jordan received his bachelor of science degree in chemical engineering from Yale University and a master of science degree in chemical engineering from Princeton University. He subsequently served a four-year tour of duty with the U.S. Navy on the staff of Admiral Hyman Rickover.
